# AMERICA! GOD SHED HIS GRACE ON THEE

The words of *America the Beautiful* were penned in 1893, and they were a reflection of God's grace shed on America. However, in the last six decades we have increasingly turned our backs on His grace.

It was amazing that, for the first time in recorded history, our Founders created a Constitution recognizing that all our rights come directly from God and not from man or government. Americans were made equal: free to worship God without permission or control of a priest, minister, governor or king; free from a class or caste system; and free to pursue any educational study or any line of work. This did not happen by accident. God sent the first Great Awakening starting in the 1730s and the second Great Awakening around 1800, with our Founders writing the Constitution and the Bill of Rights during this special time of His presence.

A majority of our Founders were Christians, while some were deists who also believed that God would intercede and answer prayers. One deist was Benjamin Franklin who asked the entire 55-man 1787 Constitutional Convention to stop working on the Constitution and pray for agreement to break a major deadlock. They prayed for over two hours, and a solution was found.

In the 200 years following Independence, America experienced tremendous progress. This has been described as the "5000 Year Leap" by W. Cleon Skousen<sup>1</sup>. He found that 28 Bible-based principles were the source of this progress which exceeded the progress made by the whole world in the previous 5,000 years. The 28 principles included: .... The table shows how pastors, even in theologically conservative churches<sup>1</sup>, are increasingly reluctant to address cultural concerns from a Biblical perspective. The table (adapted from a July 2016 article<sup>2</sup> of The American Culture & Faith Institute) shows how many churches plan to address the topics in a sermon or other teaching in 2016 compared with 2014.

This reluctance of the majority of our pastors is in stark contrast to the words and actions of Peter and John when they were oppressed by the governing authorities of their day: "Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness" (Acts 4:29). Therefore, please join us in: praying for our pastors, encouraging our pastors to speak boldly on cultural concerns, and to support our pastors in attacks that will inevitably come.
